PROPOSITION 4 Dragons

Shall the Board of Education of the De Soto #73 School District, Missouri, without an estimated increase in the current debt service property tax levy, borrow money in the amount of Nineteen Million Dollars (\$19,000,000) for the purpose of providing funds for the betterment of school facilities to include, without limitation: heating, ventilation, and air conditioning (HVAC) upgrades, repair or replacement of roofs, installation of security cameras and security film to windows, additional exterior lighting, and technology upgrades District-wide; bleacher and turf replacement at the J.C. Culwell stadium; implementation of ADA accessibility to Athena Elementary School hallways and DeSoto Junior High School gymnasium; to the extent funds are available, acquire buses and complete other repairs and improvements to the existing facilities of the District; and issue general obligation bonds for the payment thereof?

If this proposition is approved, the adjusted debt service levy of the School District is estimated to remain unchanged at \$0.9801 per one hundred dollars of assessed valuation of real and personal property.

The extended tax will be collected in addition to the other sales taxes provided for by law on all retail sales made in the City of Herculaneum, Missouri that are subject to taxation.
