Proposition 1 - Shall the Board of Education of the School District of the City of DeSoto, Jefferson County, Missouri, be authorized to incur an indebtedness of said District in the amount of Seventeen Million Dollars (\$17,000,000) for the purpose of erecting a new high school, repairing old buildings, and furnishing schoolhouses in said District and to evidence such indebtedness by the issuance of bonds of said District in said amount for said purpose?

Proposition 2 - Shall the Board of Education of the School District of the City of DeSoto, Jefferson County, Missouri, be authorized to eliminate the reduction in the operating tax levy for school purposes as provided in Section 164.013, R.S.Mo., as amended (Proposition C rollback), in the additional amount of Fifteen Cents (15) per one hundred dollars of assessed valuation to meet additional operating fund needs of the District? (If approved, this proposition would partially eliminate the rollback, increasing the school district's operating levy by up to an additional Fifteen (15) Cents per one hundred dollars of assessed valuation in tax year 2000 and subsequent years.)

NORTHWEST R-1 SCHOOL DISTRICT

Proposition - Shall the School Board of Northwest R-I School District be authorized to increase the operating levy by forty-nine cents (\$.49) per one hundred dollars of assessed valuation for the purpose of acquiring computers and other technology, increasing employee compensation and other operational expenses? If this proposition is approved, the adjusted operating levy of the school district is estimated to be four dollars and three cents (\$4.03) per one hundred dollars of assessed valuation.

VISION 2000 - Shall the board of Education of Reorganized School District R-VII of Jefferson County, Missouri, borrow money in the amount not to exceed Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000) for the purpose of providing funds for the construction, equipping, and furnishing of a new middle school; to complete other remodeling and repair improvements to the existing facilities of the District such as upgrading the kitchen, parking and library at the Platin Primary Elementary School; the upgrading of the library, parking and installation of a track at the Danby-Rush Tower building with other modifications necessary to convert it to a high school; to complete the four shelled classrooms at the Telegraph Intermediate School; and issue bonds for the payment thereof?
